



Statement of Commitment to Child Safety

Little Adventures Early Learning is committed to providing a child safe environment where children and young people are safe, feel safe, and their voices are both heard and valued regarding decisions that affect their lives.

We value the diversity of all children and families in our community, including the cultural safety of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, as well as the safety of children with additional needs or a disability.

Every person at Little Adventures Early Learning is expected to prioritise the wellbeing and safety of all children and young people in all they do and every decision they make, both as individuals and collectively as a team. We commit to implementing the 10 Child Safe Standards so that we can prevent, detect and effectively respond to child abuse.

We will ensure all staff who work with children have a current Working with Children Check (WWCC) as well as National Criminal History Check, as well as Prohibited Persons and Suspended Educators Checks. Staff will be supported through induction, training and professional development to ensure they understand the importance of protecting children from harm, and that they understand the process of reporting any child safety issues with relevant organisations, with support from management.

Likewise, volunteers and regular visitors to our service will also be required to hold a current Working with Children Check and will always be supervised by educators to ensure their behavior aligns with our service's child safe practices to uphold the dignity and rights of the child throughout their interactions with them. Adherence to our services Technology & Online Safety Policy and Mobile Phone & Personal Device Policy is also required and prohibits the use of any personal electronic devices to photograph or record others.
